their fellowship with other believers to keep them strengthen and balanced. Knowing God's Word and having the camaraderie with other believers will keep believers from going backwards and falling through the cracks. In this, you will find that serving one another will strengthen and complete you; then in turn you are able to strengthen your brethren.

That brings me to Luke 10, where Jesus tells a certain lawyer of the Parable of the "Good Samaritan!" The lawyer wanted to know how to inherit eternal life. He knew the Law but wanted to know who his neighbor was or in other words, which neighbor is Jesus talking about? He saying, well, I have my next door neighbors and I have my influential neighbors. Jesus is not impressed, but goes on to teach a lesson to him—*'a man on the road went down from Jerusalem to Jericho, attacked, robbed and stripped by thieves, and left for dead.'*

The gist of what the man was asking — who is his neighbor?, should have been—to whom can I be a neighbor to or how can I be a neighbor? "**Love**" was an important key to receiving eternal life. And the point is to love God and

would be the duty of individuals who are of the body of Christ where many members reside, so none would fall through the cracks.

The church cannot stay locked up praying behind closed doors, but they will have to go beyond the walls to find those neighbors and when new members become a part of the church, accept them for who they are—a part of the body of Christ. It's not enough to bring them in, they will need to feel much more love and acceptance after they have made that most important initial step to come in.

In the parable, the priest came down "by chance", saw him, but passed by on the other side after doing his priestly duties in the Temple. The Levite who is assistant to the priest came by, looked at the man and passed by on the other side also. Both viewed the circumstances but did nothing. But Jesus had one who would do the unthinkable, go beyond and above what was needed and stop to aid the man.

I was presented with a similar situation years ago:

1. The hours of my job was 4AM. I would drive by this bus stop every morning and see this homeless man with long hair talking

out loud. Now I was led to do this by the Lord the next morning. I prepared a sandwich, fruit, and water; stopped and gave it to him along with a scripture of God's Word. That was it, as I prayed for him driving to work. I didn't see him again. Strange!

2. Another time I was on my way to an early morning bible study, and there was a man laying on the side of the curb of the road. I drove by at first, then I made a u-turn back to see if anyone had called the police because there were other people near by. I stayed to see the police come; he was drunk on the side of the road. Wow!

You know that show on TV, '**What would you do?**' This reminds me of these God interruptions of not wanting others to fall by the wayside or not allowing them to fall through the cracks. No matter how God uses you, Love is an important element in strengthening your brethren. I apologize to those who have fallen through the cracks of life in the church. This should not be. My hope is to those who still feel in limbo after coming to Christ, to know you have been **Accepted by the Almighty God** long before you were born! Don't fall into the trap of despair. HEAT RELATED PROBLEMS

Many of us live in or visit regions where sunburn, heat exhaustion, and heat stroke occur as the Summer's potential health risks. During hot weather, especially with high humidity, sweating just isn't enough. Your body temperature can rise to dangerous levels and you can develop a heat illness. Some Heat Related Problems are:

1. Heat Cramps,
2. Heat Exhaustion, and
3. Heat Strokes

- Cool pale, and clammy skin.
- Heavy sweating.

HEAT RELATED SYMPTOMS:

- Dilated pupils.
- Headache, nausea, dizziness, faintness, rapid pulse, and breathing.

Heat Cramps can be in the muscles being used while exercising or working in warm temperatures, or there can be abdominal cramps. Sweating depletes the body's salt and moisture. The low salt level in the muscles causes painful cramps.

TREATMENT OF HEAT CRAMPS:

- Stop all activity, and sit quietly in a cool place.
- Get out of the heat.
- Drink cool water or sport drinks in small amounts-not big gulps.
- Eat some salty food.
- Massage the cramped muscle, gently stretching it for 20 seconds.

Heat Exhaustion occurs when people work or exercise in hot humid conditions.

- Get the person to a

cool area.

TREATMENT OF HEAT EXHAUSTION:

- Loosen or remove the persons clothing.
- Have the person lie on his or her back with the feet slightly raised.
- Give cool water or electrolyte sports' drink.
- Call the doctor's office for advice if you don't notice an improvement within a half hour.

Heat Stroke This is where the body temperature rises rapidly to 104° or higher. There is a strong, rapid pulse, confusion or unconsciousness with vomiting. Heat Strokes are life threatening. It requires immediate medical attention. Call for an ambulance immediately.

While waiting for help, wrap him or her in wet sheets and fan them until help arrives. Give the person water if he or she is able to drink.

- Wear loose fitting, light-colored, lightweight

- Drink plenty of fluids.
- Take extra precautions with certain medications.
- Don't stay in a parked car.

they are determining the nation's fate. May they see favor coming into their lives that keeps them firmly standing on solid ground.


