At the age of 33, Jesus was con-

demned to the death.

Crucifixion was the "worst" death. Only the worst criminals were condemned to be crucified. Yet, it was even more dreadful for Jesus who was innocent: His hands and feet nailed to the Cross. Each nail was 6 to 8 inches long going through both of His feet—nailed together. Thus He was forced to support Himself on the single nail that impaled His feet to the cross. Jesus could not support Himself

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"I shall go to him, but he shall not return to me" 2 Samuel 12:23.

When you think about it, dying is daily: we die to things and circumstances and people, but we are dying in corruptible bodies. And we must DIE to LIVE, whether you look at it in the spiritual sense or even in the physical sense, dying is the final course to life. Celebrate life now, so you will know how to celebrate your loved ones when they leave this earth! Jesus celebrated His disciples before He left by washing their feet. Now celebrate Jesus by talking about Him! God Bless!

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with His legs because of the pain. So, He was forced to alternate between arching His back, then, using His legs just to continue to breathe. Imagine His Struggle, His Pain, His Suffering, and His Courage!

Blood and water poured from His wounded side. The human adult body contains about 3.5 liters (just less than a gallon) of blood. Jesus poured all 3.5 liters of His blood; He had three nails hammered into His body; a crown of thorns on His head and, beyond that, a Roman soldier stabbed a spear into His side.

But, before the nails and the spear, Jesus was whipped and beaten. The whipping was so severe that it tore the flesh

His body; the from beating so horrific that His beard was ripped face. His The from "Crown of Thorns" cut deeply into His scalp. Most men would not have survived this torture.

Jesus endured this reality for over 3 hours. Can you imagine this kind of Suffering? But, do we realize how deep His wounds were actually pierced into His body?—flesh falling off His body!

Jesus had to endure this experience— this humiliation; carrying His own Cross for almost 1.2 miles, while the crowd spat in His face; stones thrown at Him; His hands and feet nailed to that wooden Cross; His side pierced—All, iust to

open the Gates of Heaven for us, so we can have free access to God; so our sins could be "washed away." All of them! With no exceptions! Don't ignore His Suffering.

JESUS CHRIST DIED FOR YOU!

Jesus died before the Roman soldiers that flogged Him. He died before the onlookers who had cried crucify Him, crucify Him, He died before His mother and more (John 19:25).

- Jesus had to be nailed to the cross, for at the cross brought crucifixion—**Death**. His crucifixion brought many together for different reasons.
- But He surrendered His Will to the Will of the Father: "not My Will, but thine be done".—Yielded

as He Will. The promise is to "he that believed in Jesus, though he were dead, yet shall he live: And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die. Believest thou this?" John 11:25-26 Martha believed and Lazarus was raised from the dead!

What about Jairus' twelve year old daughter, at the point of death, then died before Jesus could get there? Jesus told the father, "Fear not: believe only, and she shall be made whole" Luke 8:50.

What about the time when Jesus was passing a funeral procession and just had compassion on the widowed mother. He said *"Weep not"*, He then touched the coffin... The boy sat up and began to speak Luke 7:13.

Jesus raised them all from the dead. If He,

the Son of man and the Son of God used His power over mere mankind upon this earth, just think about what the Father could do, that is, raise up Jesus, His own Son from the dead!

Even so, during these times, Jesus' own disciples that followed Him still needed proof and clarification. They couldn't believe that Jesus had to die, let alone come back and be seen by many after death.

But they would soon find out that on the 3rd day according to the scriptures He would be Resurrected!

Mary had come to the tomb, saw that the stone was rolled away. An angel said *"why are you looking for the living among the dead?"* That's a symbolic statement for those that go back to the gravesite to visit their own loved ones. They're not there. 

THE RESURRECTION Matthew 28:5-10

I know that ye **seek** Jesus, which was **crucified**. He is not here: for he is **risen**... **Come**, see the **place** where the **Lord** lay. And go **quickly**, and tell his **disciples** that he is risen from the dead; and, **behold**, he **goeth** before you into **Galilee**; there shall ye see him: lo, I have told you. And they **departed** quickly from the **sepulcher** with **fear** and **great joy**; and did **run** to bring his disciples **word**. And as they went to **tell** his disciples, behold, Jesus met them, saying, <u>All hail</u>. And they came and held him by the **feet**, and **worshipped** him.
